Town Council Meeting

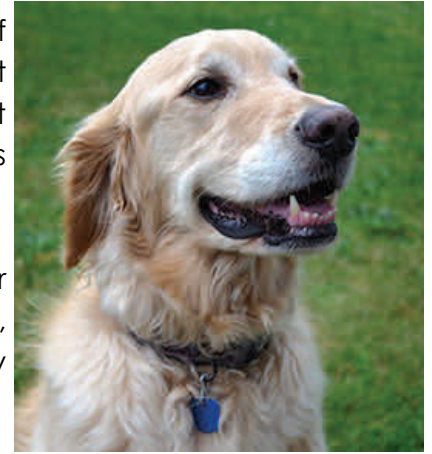
February 1, 2016 - Highlights

- ▶ Mayor Richard Burcombe presides over the sitting of Council.
- ▶ Council confirms that the organization, management and promotion of the Town's tourism activities has now been delegated to the non-profit organisation *Lac-Brome Recreation and Community Services*.
- ▶ It authorizes the signing of the Intermunicipal agreement concerning the completion of an inventory of ash trees in the public domain of Bromont, Cowansville, Farnham and Brome Lake.
- ▶ It authorizes the purchase of a half-ton pickup truck at a cost of \$ 40 813.82, including taxes.
- ▶ It gives the UMQ its usual mandates concerning a group purchase of various dust suppressant products.
- ▶ Council accepts the formation of a single Housing Authority resulting from the combination of Bromont, Granby and Waterloo and Brome Lake's four existing municipal offices.
- ▶ It adopts By-Law 2016-01 on Committees. It constitutes the Town's "Environment Advisory" and "Boating Safety" committees and appoints its respective members.
- ▶ It asks the Foster service branch of the MTQ to grant the annual road permission for interventions on sewage systems and aqueducts.
- ▶ It authorizes total contributions of \$ 16,000 to various organizations and declares the closure and sale of a disaffected part of Eugene Street.
- ▶ Council dissolves any Town committee formed by resolution prior to the present sitting of Council.

Reminder : Dog Licenses

It's the start of a new year and Town of Brome Lake would like to remind you that under Bylaw 614, any dog habitually kept within the limits of the municipality requires a license.

This bylaw does not apply to puppies under 3 months of age or to dogs kept in kennels, pet shops, animal hospitals, veterinary clinics or shelters.



The annual fee is \$10 per animal, or you can now get a lifetime license for your dog at a cost of \$50. You can obtain a license at the reception desk at Town Hall during office hours.

Reminder : Civic Numbers

To ensure safety and to make it easier for emergency services to find your home, Town of Brome Lake requires all buildings, including mobile homes, to display the civic number (street address) allocated by the Town.

Your civic number must be visible from the road at all times.

The Bylaw requires all homeowners to ensure that the civic number is legible and in good order and is not obstructed by vegetation (trees, shrubs and flowers), snow or any kind of permanent or temporary signage.

Reminder: Garbage and Recycling

Under Article 10 of Bylaw 554 regarding waste collection, transportation and disposal, any bulky non-metallic objects must be put out on the curb between 5 pm the night before the collection and 6 am on the day of the collection. Bins must be placed with the limits of the property, at the front of the building, along the side of the road, next to the entrance to the property.

At all other times, bins must be removed from the side of the road and stored at least 3 metres away from the property line.

Bins must never reduce visibility for road users, nor obstruct the sidewalk or roadway.
