Dear fellow citizens,

Over the last two months the administration has worked diligently to prepare for the future of Brome Lake. Perhaps you were already aware of this, but the review of the Urban Plan holds a central place among the major files that will occupy the Town this year. I'm pleased at the progress to date, and I can assure you that 2026 will be an important year for this work, which is essential to the harmonious development of our territory and the protection of Brome Lake's unique identity.

This work is not done behind closed doors. To the contrary, it's part of a coherent and evolutionary process that began a number of years ago. Think of the adoption of the Housing Policy, which seeks to better respond to the needs of the present and future population while focussing on a diversified residential offer.

To this can be added, the Architectural Guide on Heritage Buildings, the first part of which was made public earlier this year, serves as a key tool for preserving the distinctive character of our built heritage. Moreover, the changes proposed for the zoning by-law presented in February show our desire to update the requirements to reflect current issues, notably the protection of the environment and quality of life.

Furthermore, the development of a planning and development vision for the Knowlton village core represents a major step for the future of the town. This collaborative process will direct future actions to reinforce the vitality, attractiveness and conviviality of the heart of Brome Lake.

Finally, I am happy to draw your attention to another project we've been waiting a long time for: the reconstruction of Fulford Road. It will finally proceed in 2026. This good news is made possible thanks to, among other things, a provincial grant of \$1.8 million. The completion of this project, evaluated at \$8 million, will not only improve safety and traffic flow but will also permit the construction of active corridors, thus contributing to our citizens' quality of life.

These significant projects are the result of collaborative work, with constant attention to the needs of our population. By pursuing this dialogue, we give ourselves the means to make Brome Lake evolve in a well thought out manner, to benefit present and future generations.

Review of the Urban Plan

Building the Brome Lake of Tomorrow *together*

Over the past years, the Town of Brome Lake has conducted several diagnostic exercises and produced strategic plans to better understand the evolution of the territory, certain themes, and the issues that flow from them. The Housing Policy (2023-2024) has shown certain socio-demographic trends as well as the important challenges of accessibility to property.

More recently, the preparation of the Architectural Guide on Heritage Buildings and the designation of areas of interest have also shown that heritage, be it architectural or landscape, is at the heart of the identity of Brome Lake, but nevertheless remains vulnerable because of the regulatory system is still limited.

These documents highlight how much Brome Lake has changed and confirm the importance of updating planning documents so that they reflect the community's new realities.

By resolution dated August 18, 2025, Council launched the review of the Urban Plan. This exercise is intended to be collaborative and engaging. The population and stakeholders of the area will be invited to contribute to the process at different stages, in particular during the public consultations which will take place at key moments during the process.

Major steps in the process

What is a Urban Plan?

The Urban Plan is a reference document which describes the Town's vision of planning and the major directions which will guide the evolution of the territory in the years to come. It proposes a detailed view on the themes that influence collective choices, notably housing, mobility, the environment, the landscape, and our heritage.

By translating this vision into directions and proposals, it serves as the framework to direct projects, plan investments, and ensure a balance between development and protection of the area. It also guides the development and updating of planning by-laws.

The Urban Plan is part of the planning responsibilities, notably the requirements of the MRC and the directives of the government in terms of territorial planning (OGAT). It will also coordinate with the 2024-2028 Strategic Plan and will follow the priorities expressed by the population.

SPRING 2027	Formal adoption of the Urban Plan.
FALL 2027	Adoption of the associated by-laws.

A Conservation Plan to Protect Our Natural Environment

The Town of Brome Lake took an important step in the protection of its natural environment with its proposal of a conservation plan for its natural areas.

This strategic tool will enable the Town to identify, protect and manage the natural areas on our territory in an ecological manner. This undertaking makes abundant sense, considering the exceptional mosaic of forests, wetlands and watercourses, particularly our beautiful Brome Lake, as habitats for numerous species in precarious situations.

By equipping ourselves with such a plan, we ensure the preservation of these ecosystems, which are essential to our quality of life, the protection of our biodiversity, and the quality of our wetlands. It is also a way to respect the conservation objectives of COP15 and Nature Plan 2030 of the Government of Quebec, which seeks to protect 30% of the territory between now and 2030.



Did you know?

The territory of the Town of Brome Lake is part of an ecological corridor which links major protected areas such as the natural resources of Green Mountains Nature Reserve and the protected area of Mount Foster. Our Town has an exceptional biodiversity with 100-year-old forests, numerous wetlands, and the essential habitats of many rare species. Protecting these natural areas is a way to protect the quality of the water of Brome Lake and the watercourses that cross our territory.

Where are we?

In collaboration with the Appalachian Corridor, the Town has completed an exhaustive portrait of its natural areas. This scientific analysis has allowed us to evaluate the ecological value of each sector of the territory according to strict criteria: quality of the habitats, ecological connectivity, presence of wetlands and still more.

The result? A prioritization strategy has been prepared. It identifies the ecologically high value sectors that should be protected as a priority. This tool will guide concrete actions of conservation for the coming years.

And now: time for citizen participation!

In April, you will be invited to a public consultation where we will present the major outlines of this strategic prioritization plan.

This will be an opportunity to discover the rich ecology of our territory and to understand the challenge of conservation.

Following that, an online survey will be launched to collect your opinions and allow you to take an active part in the prioritization of the action plan. The conservation of our natural areas is everybody's business!

Stay tuned to know the exact date of the public consultation.

The Town of Brome Lake will launch a strategic review of the future of its town core. This essential step, conducted as part of the review of the Urban Plan, seeks to ensure a harmonious evolution of the village, respectful of its unique identity, its heritage and its exceptional landscape.

This initiative is driven by a dual context. On the one hand, the vitality of the present real estate market prompts us to better manage future development to preserve its quality. On the other hand, the coming renewal of our underground infrastructure offers an opportunity to rethink the layout of streets and public spaces. It is a pivotal moment to reflect together on the cohesiveness of this important sector.

The objective is to produce an inspiring and stimulating illustrated document which will serve as the foundation for the public space redevelopment plan and future by-law changes.

To allow time to complete this review, the Municipal Council adopted an Interim Control By-law (ICB) in August 2025. This by-law temporarily suspends certain types of projects within the village core perimeter.

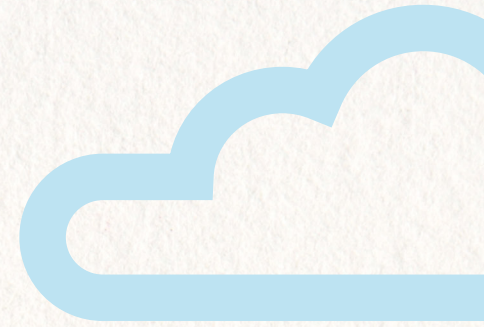
